SEPTEMBER

OCTOBER

Community Colleges:

- ☐ Begin considering which community college is right for you at <u>www.cccco.edu</u>
- ☐ The local Los Rios District (Folsom Lake, Sac City, American River, & Cosumnes River) begin accepting applications in February.
- ☐ Attend the Regional College Fair on September 24, 2019 at Union Mine High School. Universities, Colleges, Community Colleges, Trade Schools and the Military will be in attendance.

- ☐ Carefully consider financial aid packages as they arrive.
- ☐ Continue scholarship searches and send in scholarship applications.

MAY

Community Colleges:

- Register for classes early! If you procrastinate you will not get the classes you want and this could mean more time to complete your degree.
- ☐ Prepare for and take AP exams if applicable.
- Make your final college/trade school/military/career selection if you have not done so.
- ☐ Talk to your counselor for any additional assistance with financial aid, housing, etc.

Trades/Careers:

- ☐ Be sure that you have followed through on all financial aid offers.
