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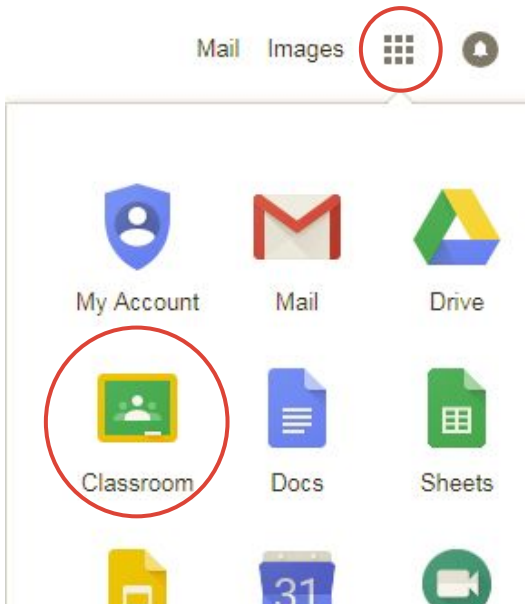

A	Social Science: 3 years (30 credits)	2 years required
B	English: 3 years (30 credits)	4 Years required
C	Mathematics 2 years (20 credits) <i>Minimum of Algebra 1</i>	3 years required <i>Must include Algebra 2</i> <i>UC recommends 4 years</i>
D	Science: 2 years (20 credits) <i>must include 1 physical science and 1 lab science</i>	2 years required <i>Must include lab sciences</i> <i>UC recommends 3 years</i>
E	LOTE, VAPA or CTE: 1 year (10 credits)	LOTE: 2 consecutive years of the same language <i>UC recommends 3 years</i> <hr/> VAPA: 1 year
G	College Prep Elective: 80 credits <i>*any class you take above and beyond the required credits will count towards College-Prep Electives</i>	1 year required

For college preparedness, please keep in mind:

- A-G classes must be passed with a “C” or better
- SAT/ACT *may* be required by colleges (visit the college’s website for clarity)
- Many colleges consider extracurricular activities in their admissions decision

Career Interests: What kind of career will help me obtain that lifestyle?



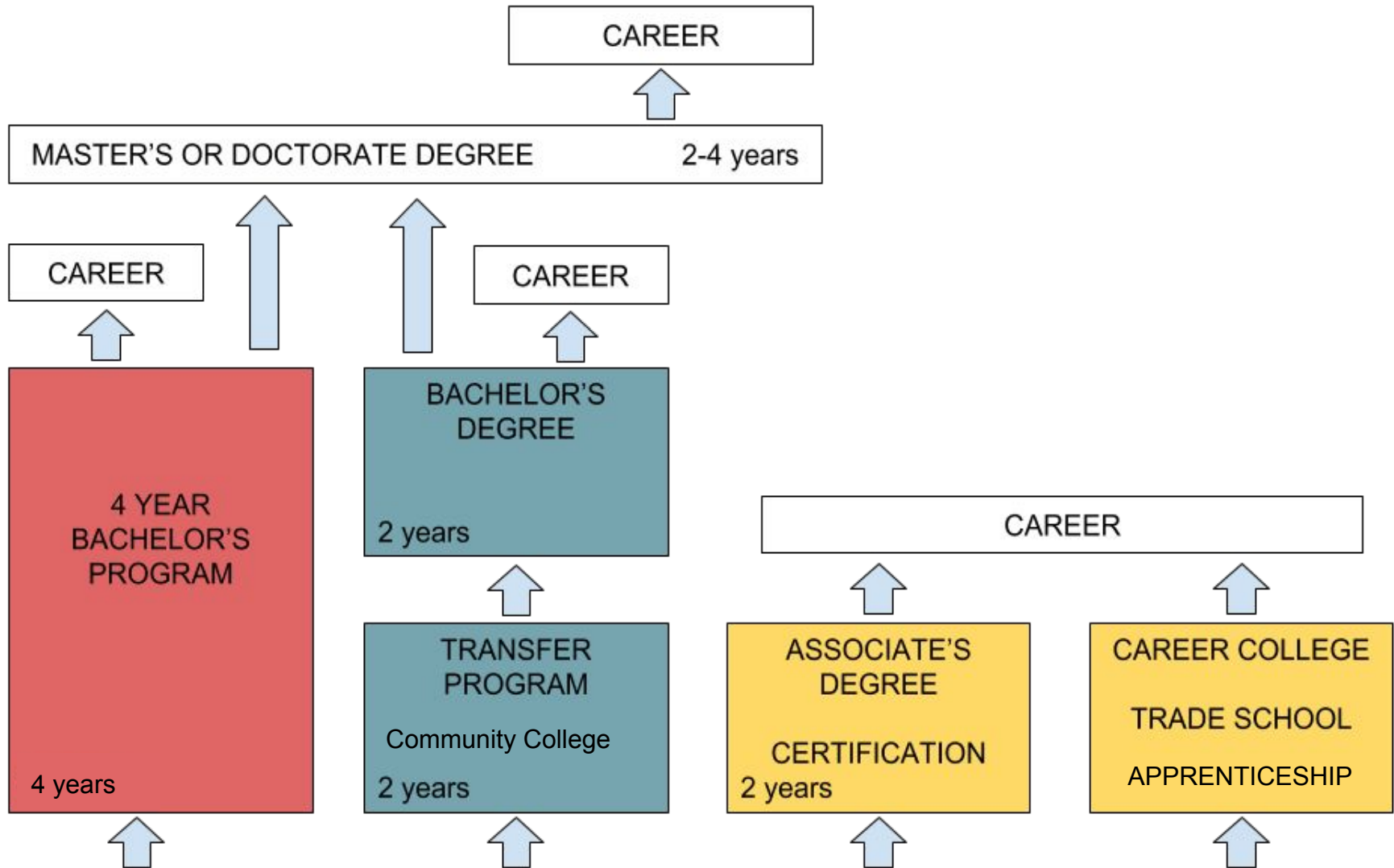
Required Training/Major: What training or major will I need to get a job in that career?

How to Apply:

Step 2: Complete the Advanced Education application found in the College & Career Center or [online](#).

Step 3: Meet with your EDHS Counselor. Your Counselor will approve your application and submit it on your behalf.

Step 4: FLC Admissions & Records will enroll you into your preferred classes and will email with confirmation.

Fall 2021

Accepting applications for 2nd 8 week classes through October 8, 2021.

Spring 2022

Accepting applications for Spring from November 1, 2021 through January 7, 2022.
