

Comparing Graduation Reqs. to A-G Reqs.



A-G	EDUHSD Graduation Requirements	CSU/UC Requirements
Α	Social Science: 3 years (30 credits)	2 years required
В	English: 3 years (30 credits)	4 Years required
С	Mathematics 2 years (20 credits) Minimum of Algebra 1	3 years required Must include Algebra 2 UC recommends 4 years
D	Science: 2 years (20 credits) must include 1 physical science and 1 lab science	2 years required Must include lab sciences UC recommends 3 years
E	LOTE, VAPA or CTE: 1 year (10 credits)	LOTE: 2 consecutive years of the same language UC recommends 3 years VAPA: 1 year
G	College Prep Elective: 80 credits *any class you take above and beyond the required credits will count towards College-Prep Electives	1 year required

For college preparedness, please keep in mind:

- A-G classes must be passed with a "C" or better
- SAT/ACT may be required by colleges (visit the college's website for clarity)
- Many colleges consider extracurricular activities in their admissions decision

Career Interests: What kind of career will help me obtain that lifestyle?




Required Training/Major: What training or major will I need to get a job in that career?

Advanced Education

Advanced Education is a program for current high school students who are interested in taking classes at Folsom Lake College. To be eligible, the student must be at least 16 years old and/or have completed 10th grade. Advanced education students may enroll in one or two college courses each semester. This is your opportunity to earn college credit for FREE!

How to Apply:

Step 1: Apply at www.losrios.edu

Step 2: Complete the Advanced Education application found in the College & Career Center or online.

Step 3: Meet with your EDHS Counselor. Your Counselor will approve your application and submit it on your behalf.

Step 4: FLC Admissions & Records will enroll you into your preferred classes and will email with confirmation.

Application Deadlines:

Fall 2021

Accepting applications for 2nd 8 week classes through October 8, 2021.

Spring 2022

Accepting applications for Spring from November 1, 2021 through January 7, 2022.


